Matters to be Addressed:

Mayor Miers presented the following proclamation to Ruth Huntington:

Proclamation

Whereas, the Constitution of the United States of America, the guardian of our liberties, embodies the principles of limited government in a Republic dedicated to rule by law; and

Whereas, September 17, 2023 marks the two hundred and thirty-fifth anniversary of the drafting of the Constitution of the Untied States of America by the Constitutional Convention; and

Whereas, it is fitting and proper to officially recognize this magnificent document and the anniversary of its creation: and

Whereas, Chapters of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution all over the world are requesting proclamations and recognition of the Constitution of the United State of America; and

Whereas, General William Maxwell Chapter of the National Society of Daughters of the American Revolution was organized in Belvidere, Warren County, New Jersey, on December 21, 1931; and

Whereas, public law 915 guarantees the issuing of a proclamation each year by the President of the United States of America designating September 17 through September 23 as constitution week.

Now, Therefore, Be it Proclaimed by the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Belvidere that September 17th through September 23rd, 2023, be designated as:

Constitution Week

In the Town of Belvidere, and ask our citizens to reaffirm the ideals the Framers of the Constitution had in 1787 by vigilantly protecting the freedoms guaranteed to us through this guardian of our liberties, remembering that lost rights may never be regained.

The Chief will be putting out the electronic speed indicator in various spots around Town. Speed bumps are being considered but this will require an ordinance amendment.
